Contributions or gifts to John Callahan for Congress Committee are not tax deductible. We may accept contributions from an individual totaling up to \$2,400 per election. An individual can contribute a maximum of \$4,800 to the Callahan campaign. Federal law prohibits contributions to the campaign from corporations, labor organizations and national banks; from foreign nationals who lack permanent resident status; and from federal government contractors. Contributions must be made from personal funds and not from funds otherwise prohibited under law. To comply with federal law, we must use best efforts to obtain, maintain and submit the name, mailing address, occupation and name of employer of individuals whose contributions exceed \$200 per election cycle.
